Correct answer receives 1 point with no penalty for guessing:  Composite First 4 sections averaged + essay graded separately.  Colleges will care about 1 score + separate essay.	Correct answer receives 1 point with no penalty for guessing:  Sum of 2 sections: (1) Reading & Evidence Based Writing; (2) Mathematics + separate essay.  Colleges see multiple scores + essay but focus on the major aforementioned two. <ul> <li>Contains a 40-minute essay question</li> <li>Select a perspective among 3 choices for persuasive essay</li> <li>Use knowledge of current events, pop culture, science, philosophy, history, literature and personal history to support argument</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Contains a 50-minute essay question</li> <li>Read a passage</li> <li>Explain that author's argument</li> <li>Support your explanation with evidence from the passage</li> </ul>	Do you prefer a straightforward response in which you choose your own point & support or a response that requires the analysis of another author's written statement?
